MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING OF BOARD OF TRUSTEES
FOR RECLAMATION DISTRICT 1614
HELD MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 10, 2018

The September Regular Meeting of the Board of Trustees of Reclamation District 1614 was held on Monday, September 10, 2018, at the law office of Neumiller & Beardslee, 509 W. Weber Avenue, 5th Floor, Stockton, California, at the hour of 2:00 p.m.

Item 1. Call to Order/Roll Call. President Kauffman called the meeting to order at 2:00 p.m.

Item 2. Public Comment. *The public may comment on any matter within the District's jurisdiction that is not on the agenda. Matters on the agenda may be commented on by the public when the matter is taken up. All comments are limited to 5 minutes for general public comment and per agenda item in accordance with Resolution 2014-06.*

Mr. Dominick Gulli introduced himself and commented on the Smith Canal project alleging that there are lies in the San Joaquin Area Flood Control Agency (SJAFCA) latest newsletter. He commented on his lawsuits and stated he was also defamed in the newsletter. Mr. Gulli also asked if the one-page candidate statement would be sent out with the election ballots. Attorney Pinasco explained the candidate statement would accompany the ballots in the event of a contested election.

Mr. Richard Gacer passed out and read his letter addressed to President Kauffman, dated September 10, 2018, re the November 2018 Election. He also handed out a copy of Water Code Section 41330 – 41338. He stated the District needs to follow the Section in how the District handles the ballots.

Mr. Bob Bellin asked what was decided at the last meeting re the upcoming District Election in reference to having candidates pay for their candidate statements. Trustee Dunning told him the District decided to pick-up that cost.

County Supervisor, Miguel Villapudua (District 1), introduced himself. He stated he would probably be SJAFCA's Chairman next year. President Kauffman thanked him for attending. Mr. Richard Gacer said he has been attending the District's meetings since 2015 and Mr. Villapudua is the first Supervisor to attend RD 1614's meetings. He proceeded to thank him for attending.

Mr. Gulli commented to Supervisor Villapudua that this District is protected by a series of levees, but from the Country Club area, going up the Calaveras River that it is maintained by the County. He said that is critical and that section of levee maintained by the County is more critical to the people that live in this District. Mr. Gulli said it is important that Supervisor Villapudua make sure the County maintenance forces are watching and maintaining it, as he said it has been neglected in the past.

Mr. Paul Guerrero stated he met with the new Executive Director of SJAFCA regarding environmental justice and briefly detailed their discussion.

President Kauffman reminded everyone that this is a RD 1614 meeting, not a SJAFCA meeting. Mr. Gulli also commented to Supervisor Villapudua the reasons why he attends RD 1614's meetings (eluding to the assessments that are collected by SJAFCA from the people of this District.)

Item 3. Approval of Minutes of the regular meeting of August 6, 2018, and the special meeting of August 17, 2018. After review,

It was moved, seconded (B. Koch/W. Dunning) and unanimously carried by the Board of Trustees of Reclamation District 1614 that the Minutes of the regular meeting of August 6, 2018, and the special meeting of August 17, 2018 be approved as read.

Item 4. Presentation of Financial Status Report. Discussion and possible action. District Secretary, Rhonda Olmo, handed out the Financial Report. She stated this is the second report for FY18/19. Mrs. Olmo noted the interest and assessments received for the General Fund. Mrs. Olmo stated that she received a phone call from Judith Buehe (Judith Buehe Communications). Ms. Buehe said the bill she previously sent the District re the Newsletter was sent in haste, and was \$297 short. Mrs. Olmo said she is requesting another warrant this month to cover the shortage. After review,

It was moved, seconded (W. Dunning/B. Koch) and unanimously carried by the Board of Trustees of Reclamation District 1614 that the Financial Report be approved as presented.

Item 5. Presentation of Engineer's is Report. Discussion and possible action:

- a. Encroachment Permit request for 1842 S. Tuxedo landside levee work. – See below.
- b. Review Status of Encroachment Permit request from Randy Pierson for fence at corner of Del Rio Ave and Kirk Ave.

Attorney Schroeder reiterated from previous meetings that the District has an easement right for a piece of property on Kirk Ave. The property owner of the adjacent property wanted to use it and approached the District to obtain some kind of right to do so. The property sold to Mr. and Mrs. Pierson. The problem was that the piece of property that the District has the easement on is a separate parcel, and when the home was purchased from the prior owner, it did not include that

parcel. The District cannot deal with the Piersons as they do not own the land, and the prior owner ended up destitute and the County Conservator is now involved. Attorney Schroeder has since set a letter to the County Conservator saying this is a non-permitted encroachment and demanded that it be removed. President Kauffman stated that perhaps the District needs the help of Supervisor Villapudua to convince the Conservator to spend the money to get this valued in property and get it resolved so it does not need to be brought up every year. Attorney Schroeder recommended that the Piersons be put in contact with Supervisor Villapudua. Another suggestion was made as to the Piersons doing a Quit Claim Deed. Attorney Schroeder said the Piersons are ready to do that, but they need cooperation from the other side.

Excerpts from the Engineer's Report:

I. AB 360 DELTA LEVEE SUBVENTIONS PROGRAM

- A. Review the outcome of Town Hall Meeting held on Wednesday August 22, 2018 at the Karl Ross Post on the homeless population in and around the Country Club area sponsored by San Joaquin County Supervisor Tom Patti.

Mr. Chris Neudeck reported that he, Trustee Koch, and Mr. Orlando Lobosco attended the Town Hall Meeting (on behalf of the District) that was sponsored by San Joaquin County Supervisor Tom Patti. He said the meeting was well attended and representatives from the Police Department, Sherriff's Department, Board of Supervisors, Public Works, and DA's office were present. Topics covered at the meeting were the homeless situation, the issues of relocating them vs. dispensing them from the site, fencing vs. finding a place for the homeless to live, pollution in the slough, damage to the levees and fences, and the theft that is occurring in neighboring homes. Mr. Neudeck said he felt the meeting was pretty well covered, but did not feel that anyone walked away with any solutions. He said the Board of Supervisors, in particular, are starting to put more effort in to these issues. Mr. Neudeck said that this District did not have any input at this time, but were recognized for attending and for the fact of working with Caltrans to get the money over to the local reclamation districts to rerock the slopes beneath I5. From a community wide basis, Mr. Neudeck felt this meeting was a good first step. Further discussion was held.

II. PLAN REVIEW

- A. Permit Request from homeowner:

Review application for existing retaining wall on landside levee slope. (*Exhibit A: March 12, 2018 Encroachment Permit, Exhibit B: March 12, 2018 Encroachment Application Retaining Wall Plans, Exhibit C: March 12, 2018 material specifications for drainage fabric and treated wood embers, Exhibit D: Assessor Parcel Number (APN) Information, and Exhibit E: Photographs of the landside levee slope retaining wall – included in Engineer's packet.*)

Mr. Neudeck reported on the permit application submitted for the retaining wall. He reviewed the exhibits with the Board. After review, Mr. Neudeck said he is satisfied with this and his recommendation is to approve with no special conditions (namely because the special conditions have been met throughout the review process.) Mr. Neudeck said if the Board accepts this he will write a letter to Mr. Beghtel indicating acceptance, and that he is not reviewing this for its structural integrity, nor is he causing them to make this permit conditional upon receipt of a building permit through the UVC. For clarification, Attorney Schroeder said there are conditions, but they are the standard conditions (second page of the application) for all permits that are issued. Those conditions are that they comply with the District's levee encroachment standards, and that they submit a new application for any future encroachments, and they sign and record the permit. President Kauffman asked if Mr. Neudeck had an access easement. Mr. Neudeck said that access easement has only been tied to the riprap. After further discussion, Mr. Neudeck said he would work on requesting an access agreement with Mr. Beghtel. President Kauffman requested that an access agreement be standard in the future. After further review, questions, and discussion,

It was moved, seconded (W. Dunning/B. Koch) and unanimously carried by the Board of Trustees of Reclamation District 1614 that the permit application from Mr. Lowell H. Beghtel, subject to standard conditions, be approved.

III. WISCONSIN PUMP STATION NO. 7

A. Review status of alternative repair design for Wisconsin Pump Station. (*Exhibit F: Email Memorandum from KSN Inc dated August 30, 2018 – included in Engineer's packet.*)

Mr. Neudeck reported on the Wisconsin Pump Station plans progress. Mr. Neudeck reviewed Exhibit F as follows:

Civil: Civil plans are nearly complete; just working through some final details with the ArmorFlex Mat.

Structural: Structural sub anticipates having plans back to KSN by the end of the week for their review.

Electrical: Electrical sub anticipates having permit application (drawings complete) in within the next 1 to 2 weeks.

Environmental/Permitting: Mr. Neudeck said he needs to addend, as he is changing the means and methods by which he is discharging. He said the initial mitigated neg dec study was done with a box in the channel itself as a bubbler and he is removing it.

Mr. Gulli suggested that PG&E service be applied for right away.

The plan is to construct latter part of next summer. Right now, Mr. Neudeck says he is on target.

IV. SMITH CANAL GATE STRUCTURE PROJECT – SAN JOAQUIN FLOOD CONTROL AGENCY (SJAFCA)

A. Update on Smith Canal gate closure project (*Exhibit G: File Memorandum dated September 4, 2018 from SJAFCA – included in Engineer's Packet.*)

Mr. Neudeck read Exhibit G, which he said, was prepared by one of SJAFCA's Engineers, and reviewed by their Executive Director. Mr. Neudeck reviewed the status updates in Exhibit G re the design, environmental, ROW, public outreach, and legal. About the design, the final 95% design documents are complete, and SJAFCA stated they were going through comments from agency, stakeholders, and independent panel of experts. Mr. Neudeck said they have now completed their review, and he has asked that SJAFCA submit their responses to the District, as RD 1614 did comment. President Kauffman asked if the 95% plans were public documents and Mr. Neudeck said he does not believe they are as they are drafts at this point. Further discussion was held regarding the plans. Mr. Gulli asked if Dad's Point was in the Stockton deep-water ship channel. Mr. Neudeck said that is an extremely technical discussion and cannot be properly held absent a map. Further discussion was held.

Item 6. Presentation of Superintendent's Report; request for direction. Mr. Lobosco handed out his Superintendent Report, and reported no abnormal conditions during his routine inspections. Mr. Lobosco noted that he had three issues of vandalism that occurred at the Plymouth Stations. The damage has been taken care of with the exception of the graffiti damage at Plymouth and Smith. Once Mr. Lobosco repairs the fence, he will have the graffiti removed.

Mr. Lobosco met with Mr. Catrina, on August 9th, at Mr. Guerrero's residence to discuss the removal of the beavers at the end of the canal. Once Mr. Catrina is confident that the beavers are not a problem he will report to Mr. Lobosco so the beaver dens can be addressed.

Mr. Lobosco indicated he is having problems securing a contractor to thoroughly clean the sumps. He will continue to seek out a contractor for future sump cleaning.

Mr. Lobosco found no abnormal conditions during his second inspection of Smith Canals north bank. He is working with Dave Carr and Rick Toy from KSN so that moving forward with his inspections he will also be able to include the south bank. Mr. Gacer said the Operations Manual does not identify who the members of the inspection crew are. Mr. Lobosco said the crew is himself, with him occasionally using his part-time employee. Mr. Lobosco calls out to his temporary employee on an as needed basis.

Item 7. Adopt Resolution 2018-09 Electing to Become Subject to the State of California's Uniform Public Construction Cost Accounting Procedures Set Forth in the Uniform Public Construction Cost Accounting Act (Public Contract Code Section 22000, Et Seq.)

Attorney Andrew Pinasco reported on this item. He said this resolution opts in to the Uniform Act in California to engage in informal bidding procedures for public projects that are not in excess of \$175K. The Uniform Act is voluntary, meaning that in order for the District to utilize these informal bidding procedures for public projects, the District has to opt in to this act by adopting a resolution, and subsequently adopt an informal bidding regulation. The resolution before the board today opts in to the Uniform Act. Mr. Pinasco asked if there were questions

about the Act or its procedures. He also spoke to the District being subject to the subventions, which has bidding requirements in itself. Further discussion was held and questions, comments were heard. After review,

It was moved, seconded (B. Koch/W. Dunning) and unanimously carried by the Board of Trustees of Reclamation District 1614 to Adopt Resolution 2018-09 Electing to Become Subject to the State of California's Uniform Public Construction Cost Accounting Procedures Set Forth in the Uniform Public Construction Cost Accounting Act (Public Contract Code Section 22000, Et Seq.)

Item 8. Report on Meetings Attended. Nothing more to report than the Town Hall Meeting discussed above.

Item 9. District Calendar. The next Regular Meeting will be on October 8, 2018.

Item 10. Items for Future Meetings. Mr. Gacer requested that the review of election water code 50730, and the California Water Code Article 2 ballots, be on the next agenda. President Kauffman clarified Mr. Gacer's statement saying that Mr. Gacer is asking that whatever the District does with the upcoming election that they make sure they are following those sections. Attorney Schroeder said if there is a contested election, he would confirm that the election is run in accordance with State law.

Attorney Schroeder reported that Neumiller & Beardslee's office would be moving mid/end January 2019. In December, he will be bringing for approval changing the meeting location and the District's business address.

Item 11. Correspondence. Attorney Schroeder commented on the upcoming Flood Coordination Meeting and encouraged the Trustees to attend.


Item 12. Motion to Approve Bills.

It was moved, seconded (B. Koch/W. Dunning), and unanimously carried by the Board of Trustees for Reclamation District 1614 that the Trustees authorize/approve the Bills to be Paid for August, 2018.

Item 12. Adjournment. The meeting was adjourned at 3:22 p.m.

ORDINANCE NO. 18-01

**AN ORDINANCE TO PROVIDE INFORMAL BIDDING PROCEDURES UNDER THE
UNIFORM PUBLIC CONSTRUCTION COST ACCOUNTING ACT
(SECTION 22000, ET SEQ., OF THE PUBLIC CONTRACT CODE)**

WHEREAS, Reclamation District 1614 (“District”) is a reclamation district formed pursuant to Water Code sections 50000 et seq.; and

WHEREAS, the District is required to follow the public bidding procedures of the Public Contract Code (commencing with section 20920) which requires all contracts for any improvement or unit of work, or for materials or supplies, in excess of twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) to be let to the lowest responsive, responsible bidder; and

WHEREAS, under Uniform Public Construction Cost Accounting Act (Public Contract Code sections 22000 et seq.) reclamation districts may adopt an alternative bidding process for public projects that do not exceed \$175,000, increasing to \$200,000 effective January 1, 2019; and

WHEREAS, the monetary limits of Public Contract Code section 22032 shall be considered and adjusted accordingly every five years; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to sections 22010 and 22030 of the Public Contract Code public agencies that wish to adopt the alternative bidding procedures of the Uniform Public Construction Cost Accounting Act must also adopt the uniform construction cost accounting standards of the Act; and

WHEREAS, Public Contract Code section 22034 provides that local agencies that have adopted the uniform cost accounting procedures shall also adopt an informal bidding ordinance governing the selection of contractors to perform projects let by contract by informal procedures as set forth in Public Contract section 22032 ; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees have adopted this Ordinance in accordance with the procedures set forth in Government Code Sections 25120 et seq.

NOW THEREFORE, The Board of Trustees of Reclamation District No. 1614 ordains as follows:

SECTION 1. Sections 18-01.01 through 18-01.04 of District Ordinance 18-01 are added to read as follows:

“**Section 18-01.01. Informal Bidding Procedures.**

Public projects, as defined by the Act and in accordance with the limits listed in Section 22032 of the Public Contract Code, may be let to contract by informal procedures as set forth in Section 22032, et seq., of the Public Contract Code.

“Section 18-01.02. Contractors List.

The District shall comply with the requirements of the Public Contract Code Section 22034.

“Section 18-01.03. Notice Inviting Informal Bids.

Where a public project is to be performed which is subject to the provision of this Ordinance, a notice inviting informal bids shall be circulated using one or both of the following alternatives:

1. Notices inviting informal bids may be mailed, faxed, or emailed to all contractors for the category of work to be bid, as shown on the list developed in Section 2.;
2. Notices inviting informal bids may be mailed to all construction trade journals as specified by the California Uniform Construction Cost Accounting Commission in accordance with Section 22036 of the Public Contract Code. Additional contractors and/or construction trade journals may be notified at the discretion of the District soliciting bids, provided however:
 - a. If the product or service is proprietary in nature such that it can be obtained only from a certain contractor or contractors, the notice inviting informal bids may be sent exclusively to such contractor or contractors.

“Section 18-01.04. Award of Contracts.

The District Board of Trustees, or its designee, is authorized to award informal contracts pursuant to this Ordinance.”

SECTION 2. If any provision of this Ordinance or application thereof to any person or circumstances is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the Ordinance, which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end, the provisions of this ordinance, are severable. The Board of Trustees hereby declares that it would have adopted this Ordinance irrespective of the validity of any particular portion thereof.

SECTION 3. This ordinance is not intended to and shall not be construed or given effect in a manner that imposes upon the city or any officer or employee thereof a mandatory duty of care toward persons and property within or without the city so as to provide a basis of civil liability for damages, except as otherwise imposed by law.

SECTION 4. Within fifteen (15) days after its final passage, the District Secretary shall cause this Ordinance to be published in full in accordance with California Government Code section 36933.

SECTION 5. This Ordinance shall become effective thirty (30) days from and after its final passage and adoption, provided it is published in a newspaper of general circulation at least fifteen (15) days prior to its effective date.

The foregoing Ordinance was introduced and the title thereof read at the regular meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Reclamation District No. 1614 held on October 8, 2018, and by a vote of the Trustees present, further reading was waived.
